Play Spaces Audit Report Presentation – Lison Daubigeon, SPARC BC.

Lison Daubigeon, Senior Researcher at SPARC B.C. presented the Langley School District Audit Report that audited municipal and playschool spaces in the City of Langley.

## 5. STANDING ITEMS

A small cohort of individuals will be given the survey to test the survey and get feedback on readability, length of survey and ease of understanding prior to going live to the public.
- c) Accessibility Audit Subcommittee: Committee briefly reviewed the updated Report from July 15, 2024; the report will be discussed more in depth at the September 24, 2024 meeting.

The committee agreed with the recommendations for the three audits; Timms Community Centre, Langley City Hall and Al Anderson Memorial Pool as suggested by SPARC BC for the first phase of the work to be completed with the current funding of \$15,000.

## 6. FOR INFORMATION

a) The recommendation sent to City Council was adopted at the July 22 regular council meeting. The funding request of \$60 thousand will be included in the 2025 Capital Budget process.
