4. PRESENTATIONS

- a. Engineering Design Guidelines
User Accessibility of Transportation Network—
Moudud Hasan, Infrastructure Engineer

Moudud Hasan presented the City of Langley transportation plan within the City of Langley's infrastructure. The report reflected the current city design standards for accessibility within the infrastructure and its future goals.

- Transportation; bus stops, future transit
- Accessible sidewalk design standards
- Pedestrians and accessible priority in design
- Design Standards for ramps, curbs and wheelchairs or powered chairs
- Crosswalks and signal activation
- Intersections and accessible pedestrian signals
- Design infrastructure that is safe and comfortable for all people

b. What We Heard Report – Dena Kae Beno

Dena Kae Beno presented a detailed report summarizing findings of the multi-sector, collaborative efforts to inform the key priorities in Langley Cities' social, cultural and economic development. The iterative community design process views critical issues from a community infrastructure environmental scan and key informants interviews identifying improvements in the following areas:

- Housing and Homelessness
- Community Safety, Health and Well-being

- Social Inclusion, Belonging, Diversity, Access and Equity
- Active Community Participation in the Economy, training and Mobility
- Community Infrastructure and Asset Development (Built, Social, Communications/Collaboration, and Natural)

The report's purpose is to identify the diverse needs and interests of Langley City, tailoring initiatives to better meet its' needs. The report conducted an environmental scan needs assessment and problem identification. The actions will inform the social, cultural and economic development framework, leading further to strategic project outcomes and development of the solutions framework.
