- An OCP requires input from many stakeholders and as such held open houses, workshops, survey's and participatory events.
- The new OCP will plan for the arrival of rapid transit and residential growth
- The Nicomekl River District Neighborhood Plan outlines policies and development permit area guidelines specific to this Neighborhood
- The draft OCP and survey will be available on the website for residents to provide their input up to February 21, 2021
