





HOMELESSNESS PREVENTION STRATEGIES

Task: identify Langley-appropriate homelessness prevention strategies.

CAPACITY BUILDING + COLLABORATION

Task: identify ways to build capacity within existing services through collaboration, partnerships, and innovative service delivery.

REAL ESTATE, LAND + BUILDINGS

Task: identify opportunities for development, redevelopment or repurposing of land/buildings to address and prevent homelessness. May or may not include potential sites or buildings.

SOCIAL FINANCING + GENERATING REVENUE

Task: identify strategies to generate revenue to support solutions to address and prevent homelessness.

TABLE TOPICS

ABORIGINAL HOUSING + SERVICES SOLUTIONS

Task: identify ways to reduce barriers for Aboriginal persons experiencing homelessness in Langley, with culturally-appropriate solutions related to housing and/or homelessness.

SENIORS HOUSING + SERVICES SOLUTIONS

Task: identify age-friendly housing and service strategies to address and prevent seniors homelessness in Langley.

YOUTH HOUSING + SERVICES SOLUTIONS

Task: identify housing and service strategies to address and prevent youth homelessness in Langley.

MENTAL HEALTH + ADDICTIONS

Task: identify strategies to support persons living with mental health issues and/or addictions, as a means to address and prevent homelessness in Langley.
