Pre-requisite Information for Sharks:

Potential Sharks must be at least 13 years old, have completed Bronze Cross, must provide two Letters of Reference from outside their family, and must be available to volunteer for at least one Al Anderson Memorial Pool Special Event.

Participants in the Sharks Program (13 years or older) must complete a mandatory Police Information Check (PIC) before admittance into the program. To complete this process, please deliver your completed information package to the front desk of Al Anderson Memorial Pool or Timms Community Centre after which you will be provided with a PIC request email to be dropped off at the Langley RCMP detachment in Murrayville located at 22180 48a Ave, Langley, BC V3A 8B7. The PIC will be sent directly to the Recreation Supervisor and requires no further action from candidates. While the application deadline is one week prior to intended start date, it is advised to complete your information package as early as possible to ensure the Police Information Check is completed before the first day of the course.

Volunteers are expected to have 100% attendance during their lesson set. Sharks are expected to wear their City of Langley Volunteer shirts while volunteering, as well as adhering to City of Langley dress standards.
