

Due to the aging underground infrastructure, City of Langley needs to start upgrades in the Fraser Highway corridor. This is taken as an opportunity to revitalize the walkways and roadworks, as well as address some feedback City heard over the years. During the last consultation in summer 2018, the local community chose "Option 3" as shown above. This includes angled parking on the north side, parallel parking on the south side with a street tree corridor.

PROJECT OBJECTIVE

- Underground services are at the end of life and need to be replaced (water, sewer and storm mains)

- Widen sidewalks to provide opportunities for patios and retail use
- Add more street furnishing




UTILITY REPLACEMENT PLAN







FRASER HIGHWAY SCOPE OF WORK



Scope of work:

- Replace existing water main, storm and sanitary sewers, and service connections
- Underground existing BC Hydro power poles
- Reconstruct full roadway from Glover Road to 206 Street
- Parking on both sides along Fraser Highway
- Replace pavers with concrete from curb to building
- Tree planting strip along both sides of Fraser Highway
- Paver plaza areas with seating, benches and plantings
- LED street lighting and update traffic signal and intersection

- Salt Lane traffic diversion during construction on Fraser One-way
- Pedestrian traffic to be maintained along Fraser One-Way during construction
- Pedestrian corridors to be fenced off

ACCESS DURING CONSTRUCTION

PEDESTRIAN ACCESS

- Sidewalks will remain open and access to business will be maintained at all times
- Construction of utility and roadworks will be done first, followed by sidewalk upgrades


VEHICLE ACCESS

- Construction will be done in two phases, east and west of Salt Lane
- There will be no vehicle access through active construction phase
- Vehicle access will be maintained through nonactive construction phase with Salt Lane used as a diversion route

PARKING

 The City of Langley will provide temporary parking lot adjacent to City Hall







CONSTRUCTION MITIGATION

NOISE

 Some noise will be unavoidable due to necessary construction activities Generally, construction noise will be permitted as per the bylaw between 7am to 7pm Monday-Friday, and 7am to 5pm Saturday.

LIMITED NIGHT-TIME WORK

Potential full road closures at night for specific works

The City will consider specific request of night-time work to intersections/busy pedestrian areas

WINTER HOLIDAYS

Construction will be shut down for a month of December



COMMUNICATION DURING CONSTRUCTION

SIGNAGE & ACCESS TO BUSINESSES

- Contractor will install information signs at limits of construction
- Contractor will install traffic pattern signage around construction area to provide clear access to businesses

COMMUNICATION

- City, Contractor and Consultant will ensure communication channels with businesses are maintained to keep people informed
- Communication strategy to be developed
- Schedule updates will be provided
